

ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF VINCENT,
ALABAMA AS FOLLOWS:

Section One: Notice is hereby given that on the 10th day of August 1976 an election for the purpose of an election of a Mayor and five (5) councilmen, which are to be elected at such election and qualified electors of the State who reside within the corporate limits of the Town of Vincent and have resided therein for 30 days or more immediately preceding the date of such election will be authorized to participate in said election will be authorized to participate in said election.

Section Two: That the voting place of said election shall be at the Town Hall in Vincent, Alabama


Section Three: A second or run off election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in September 1976, if necessary. The Municipal Officers elected shall assume the duties of their respective offices on the first Monday in October following such election and shall serve for a term of four years.

Section Four: That the Mayor and Clerk be and they are hereby directed to give notice of said election at least forty days prior to the date of holding the same or before the third Tuesday in June preceding the election by giving notice by posting in three public places within the Town as provided by law.

Section Five: That any person desiring to become a candidate at such election may become such a candidate by filing in the office of the Mayor, the clerk having been designated to accept such statements of Candidacy in the Town Hall between the hours of Five o'clock P.M. until Six o'clock P.M. beginning Tuesday evening June 15th and each evening thereafter with the exceptions of July 6th when the hours will be from 4 o'clock P.M. until 5 o'clock P.M. which is the deadline for accepting said statements of candidacy, and with the exceptions of Sunday and Mondays at which time the clerk will not be available. Such statement shall be filed by 5:00 o'clock P.M. on the first Tuesday in July 1976 and shall be substantially in the following form.

I, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, depose and say that I am a citizen of the Town of Vincent, Alabama, in Shelby County and reside in the Town of Vincent, Alabama; that I desire to become a candidate for the office of _____ in the Town of Vincent for the term of four years at the election for such office to be held on the second Tuesday in August 1976, being August 10, 1976; that I am duly qualified and have met requirements to present myself as a candidate for said office and I hereby request that my name be printed upon the official ballot at said election:

Section Six: That the requirement of the payment of a qualification fee in the amount of \$50.00 for the candidacy of the office of Mayor and \$25.00 for the candidacy of the office of Councilman. This section does not exclude a pauper who by oath may submit himself for a candidate.

SECTION SEVEN: That the Municipal Governing body or a majority of them shall, not more than 20 nor less than 15 days before the holding of said election, appoint election officials from the qualified electors of the Town of Vincent to hold said election as provided for in Section 7 of Act No 663 of the 1961 Regular Session of the Legislature of Alabama as amended:

SECTION EIGHT: That the Mayor shall be and he is hereby directed to notify the election officials of their appointment and he is hereby directed to post a list of them in three public places within the Town of Vincent, Alabama as provided by law.

SECTION NINE: That the clerk shall post in three public places within the Town of Vincent a list of qualified electors eligible to vote in said election to be held on August 10, 1976 and in the run off election if necessary to be held September 14th 1976. A supplemental list may contain those qualified electors who move into the Town of Vincent after July 6th and prior to July 11th. The original list of qualified voters shall be posted no later than June 6, 1976.

SECTION Ten: That the polls shall be opened at eight o'clock in the morning and kept open without any intermission or adjournment until the hour of seven o'clock in the afternoon of August 10th, 1976 and no longer.

AN ACT

Relating to Shelby County; to require all polling places to remain open between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. at all state and local elections held in the county; and to repeal Act No. 249, H. 873 of the 1975 Regular Session (Acts of Alabama 1975, p. 782) relating to the hours polling places remain open during elections.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of Alabama:

Section 1. All polling places within Shelby County shall remain open between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. for all state and local elections held in the county.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are hereby repealed and Act No. 249, H. 873 of the Regular Session 1975 (Acts 1975, p. 782) is expressly repealed.

Section 3. The provisions of this act are severable. If any part of the act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the part which remains.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
